

AN ORDINANCE TO PROTECT THE SAFETY AND HEALTH BY PROVIDING FOR GARBAGE CONTAINERS AND CERTAIN ACTS WITH RELATION TO THE USE OF THE TOWNSHIP DUMP.

The Township of Republic Ordains:

Section 1. The word "garbage" for the purposes of this ordinance shall mean all refuse, both animal and vegetable, ashes, tin cans, waste paper, bottles, boxes, rubbish and any other waste matter or material.

Section 2. Every person, firm or corporation which is the owner or occupant of a dwelling or building in the township, which building is situated within 500 feet of any other dwelling or building, and who stores garbage outside the confines of said building, shall have the duty to store said garbage in water-tight metallic containers which shall be of convenient size and not larger than what is commonly called a thirty gallon container. Said container shall at all times be covered with a water-tight metallic cover which securely fastens or seals the container. Other provisions notwithstanding, no garbage shall be burned within the township limits of Republic.

Section 3. All persons who use the Township dump for the purpose of disposing garbage shall deposit said garbage over the edge of the dump at the place designated by the person in charge of said dump or by the signs which shall be posted at the Township dump.

Section 4. Garbage shall not be dumped in any place within the confines of Republic Township other than the Township dump or such other place designated as a dump by action of the Township Board.

Section 5. Any person violating or neglecting to comply with the requirements of this ordinance or any of the provisions hereof, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$100.00 or by imprisonment in the county jail not to exceed 90 days or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 6. This ordinance is ordered to take effect 30 days after its publication in a newspaper circulated within the township of Republic.
