

**ORDINANCE NO. 19**

The Board of Republic Township,  
That Ordinance No. 19 is hereby  
adopted on November 12, 1981, known  
as

**WINTER PARKING ORDINANCE**

"AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING  
THE PARKING OF VEHICLES ON  
STREETS AND ALLEYS IN THE  
TOWNSHIP OF REPUBLIC BET-  
WEEN THE HOURS OF ONE  
O'CLOCK (1:00) A.M. AND SIX  
O'CLOCK (6:00) A.M. FROM  
NOVEMBER 15 UNTIL MAY 1 AND  
ESTABLISHING A TOWNSHIP PARK-  
ING VIOLATIONS BUREAU TO AC-  
CEPT PLEAS OF GUILTY AND TO  
COLLECT AND RETAIN FINES AND  
COSTS PRESCRIBED UNDER THE  
PROVISIONS OF THIS OR-  
DINANCE."

**Section 1. SHORT TITLE**  
This ordinance shall be known by  
short title, "Winter Parking Or-  
dinance."

**Section 2. CERTAIN WINTER PARK-  
ING DECLARED NUISANCE**

The parking of automobiles, trucks or  
other vehicles on the streets, sidewalks  
and alleys of the Township of Republic  
between the hours of one o'clock A.M.  
(1:00 A.M.) and six o'clock A.M. (6:00  
A.M.) between November 15 and May 1  
of each year is by these presents,  
declared to be a hindrance to the proper  
and necessary removal of snow from  
the streets, sidewalks and alleys, and a  
hindrance to the elimination of traffic  
hazards caused by snow and ice, and  
such parking is hereby declared to be a  
nuisance.

**Section 3. PROHIBITION OF CER-  
TAIN WINTER PARKING**

No individual, partnership, company  
or corporation shall park any  
automobile, truck or other vehicle on  
the streets, sidewalks, and alleys in the  
Township of Republic between the  
hours of one o'clock A.M. (1:00 A.M.)  
and six o'clock A.M. (6:00 A.M.) be-  
tween November 15 and May 1, provided  
that this prohibition shall not apply to  
physicians on emergency calls.

**Section 4. IMPOUNDING OF CER-  
TAIN VEHICLES**

Any automobile, truck, or other vehi-  
cle parked or abandoned in violation of  
Section 2 herein shall be impounded and  
may be ordered towed away by any  
police officer of the Township of  
Republic or by the Township Super-  
visor or by any person designated by  
the Township Supervisor. Any such per-  
son impounding a vehicle as aforesaid  
shall affix a tag to such vehicle stating  
the date and time such vehicle was  
found parked or abandoned in violation  
of this ordinance, requiring the owner  
to report at a certain time at the  
Republic Township Parking Violations  
Bureau or the 96th District court,  
Ishpeming, Michigan, as hereinafter  
provided, on a charge of violating this  
Ordinance.

**Section 5. PARKING VIOLATIONS  
BUREAU**

There is hereby created the Republic  
Township Parking Violations Bureau,  
the purpose of which is to accept pleas  
of guilty in parking violation cases  
under this Ordinance and to collect and  
retain fines and costs as prescribed by  
this Ordinance. The Parking Violations

Bureau is to be operated through the of-  
fice of the Republic Township Clerk. All  
expenses of the operation of this Bureau  
shall be borne by the receipts of the  
Bureau and any appropriations made to  
the Bureau through the Republic  
Township Clerk's office by the Republic  
Township Board.

**Section 6. FINE ON VIOLATION**

Any individual, partnership, com-  
pany or corporation who shall be found  
guilty of violating this Ordinance shall  
pay a fine thereof in the amount of Five  
Dollars (\$5.00) for the first offense and  
in the amount of Twenty-five Dollars  
(\$25.00) for each offense thereafter in  
any one year. Such fines to be paid at  
the Republic Township Parking Viola-  
tions Bureau, Republic, township  
Clerk's office, within forty-eight (48)  
hours. Any person accumulating three  
unpaid tickets will be given a court ap-  
pearance, stating the time to appear in  
the 96th District Court. The District  
Judge may, in addition to assessing a  
fine, impose a jail sentence of not less  
than One day (1) and not more than  
Two days (2) in the Marquette County  
Jail.

**Section 7. COSTS OF VIOLATION**

The owner of any such vehicle found  
guilty of violating this Ordinance,  
whose vehicle is ordered towed away,  
shall, in addition to paying the fine  
herein provided, pay all necessary  
costs of impounding, hauling, towing  
away or storing said vehicle, and of im-  
prisonment in the Marquette County  
Jail and the same shall be collected in  
the same manner as fines. Said costs  
shall be determined at the date of the  
hearing and shall constitute a lien  
against said vehicle until paid.

**Section 8. SEVERABILITY**

The several sections of this Or-  
dinance shall be deemed severable, and  
should any section, clause, or provision  
thereof be declared unconstitutional or  
contrary to the laws of the State of  
Michigan, and therefore voided by any  
court of competent jurisdiction, the  
same shall not affect the validity of the  
Ordinance as a whole or any part  
thereof other than that part or section  
so declared to be unconstitutional or in-  
valid.

**Section 9. POLICE EFFECT**

This Ordinance is declared to be  
necessary for the protection of the  
public health, safety, welfare and peace  
of the people of the Township of  
Republic, and is not to be construed as a  
substitute for the provisions of the  
Michigan Vehicle Code, Public Act of  
1945, No. 87 as amended, but shall be  
considered to be supplementary  
thereto.

**Section 10. EFFECTIVE DATE**

This Ordinance was adopted by the  
Republic Township Board of Marquette  
County, Michigan, at a meeting held on  
November 12, 1981, and notice ordered  
published in the Mining Journal, a  
newspaper having general circulation  
in said Township of Republic, said  
publication to be made within thirty  
(30) days after adoption. This amended  
Ordinance shall become effective im-  
mediately upon publication.
